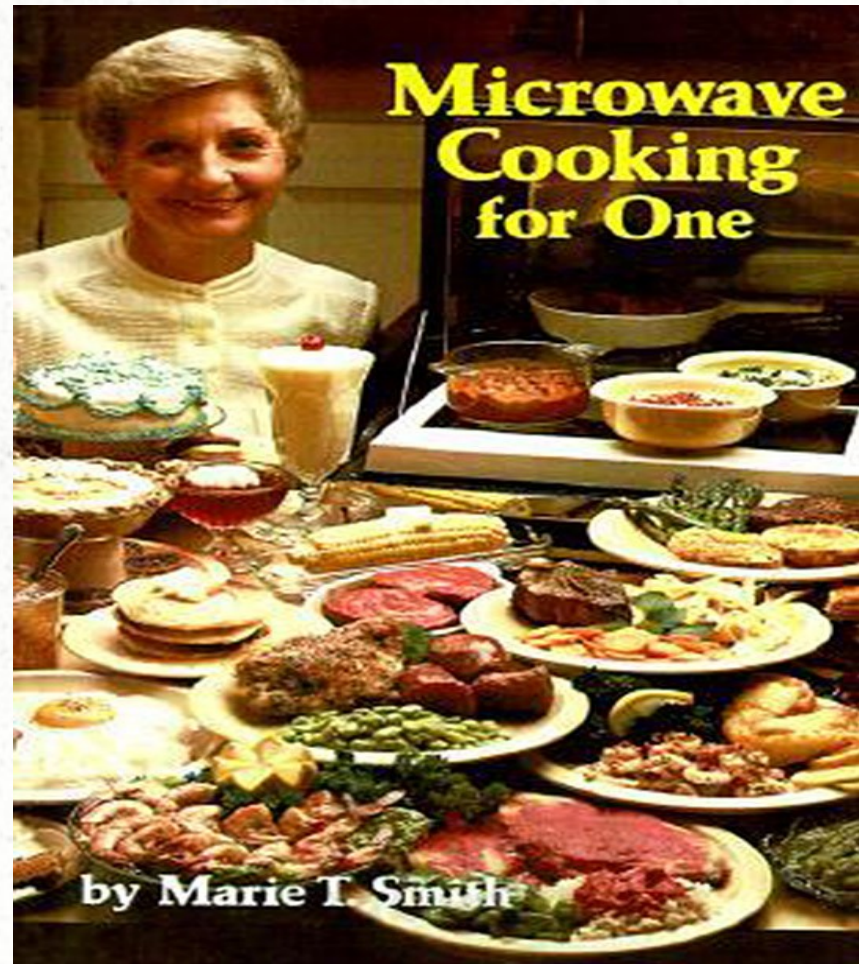
Start Boiling Eggs Before You Make A Turkey

- Did I mention Google?



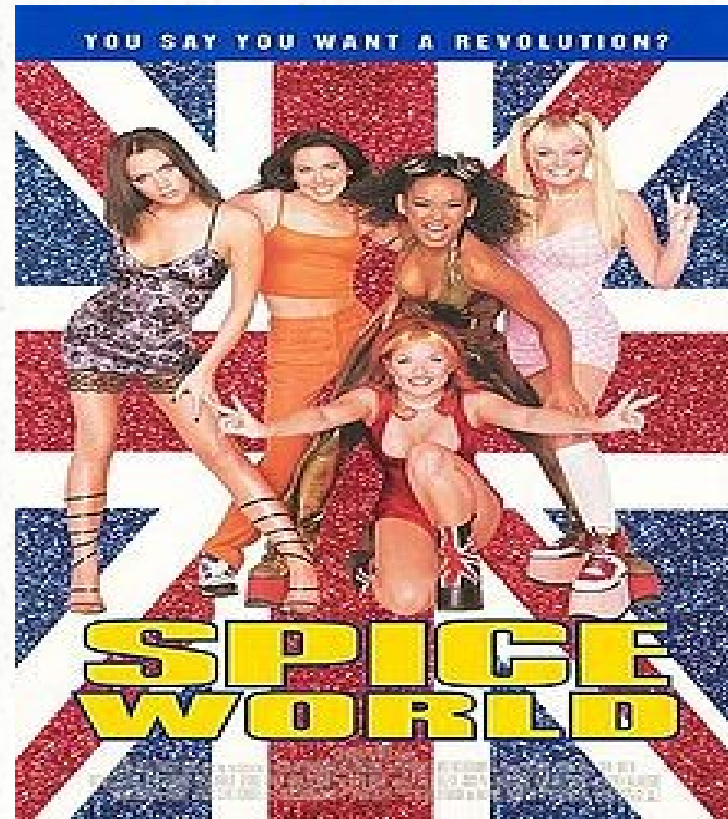
One Spice Does Not Fit All

- Allow the tech to add to your lesson not take away



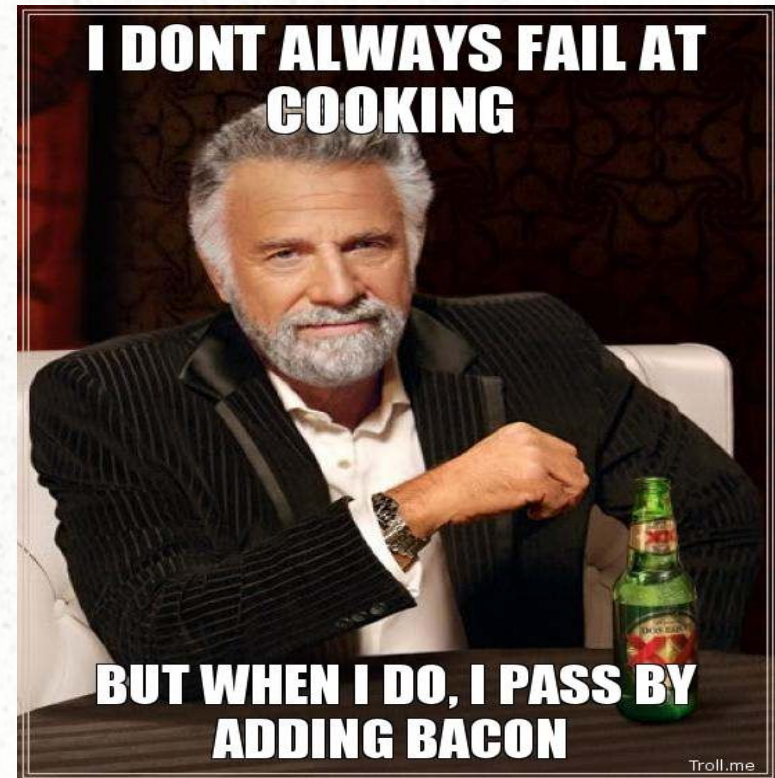
You Need A Few Bad Meals Before You Create A Masterpiece

- Instead assess what went wrong and make modifications



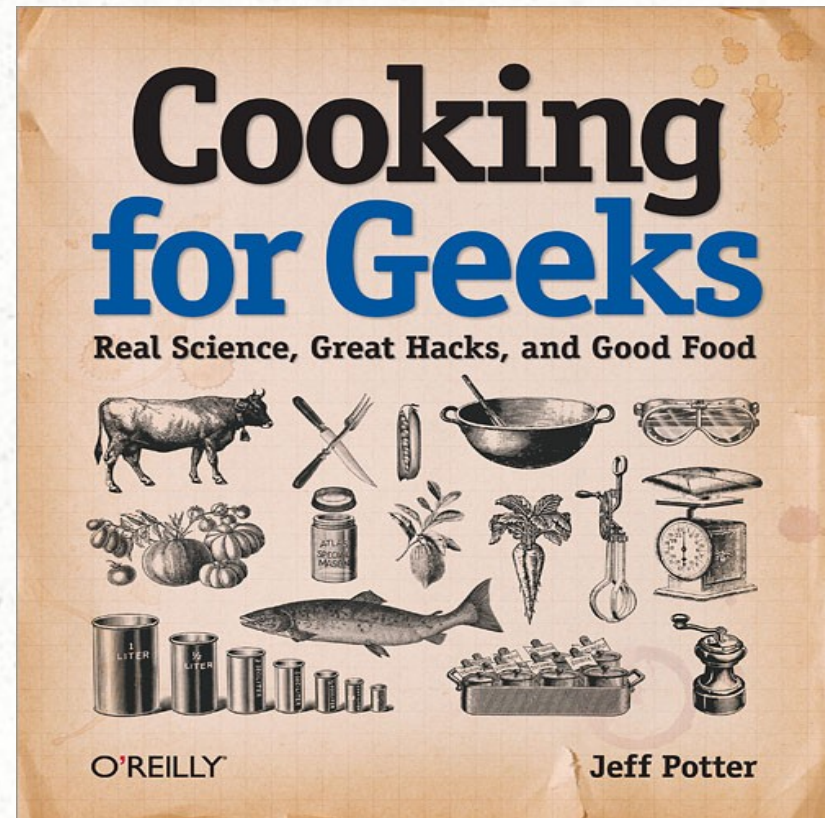
When You Finally Get the Right Recipe, Write It Down!
