- Having students submit assignments online


#### Setting up DropBox

Open up a web browser and go to www.dropbox.com



### Setting up DropBox

Download Dropbox onto your computer.

#### **Downloading Dropbox...**

Your Dropbox download should automatically start within seconds. If it doesn't, restart the download.



1. Save the Dropbox application

Click Save File when prompted.



2. Open the Dropbox Installer

From your browser's Downloads window, double click the .exe file that just downloaded.



3. Follow Setup Instructions

Follow the instructions to get Dropbox set up on your computer and you will be good to go!








Dropbox for BlackBerry

DROPitTOme allows students to submit assignments directly to your Dropbox.



Students navigate to your DROPitTOme page and enter the simple password you give them



Students click on Choose File and then select the file they want to upload and then click upload.





When you log back into Dropbox you will then see the file they uploaded. From here you can organize them into sub folders for better organization.
